Microblading

 A guest from Swampscott described her experience with getting her eyebrows microbladed on two separate occasions, once in Worcester and once in Italy. She discussed what the process was like from a client's perspective, including what happened during the appointment, the aftercare instructions she received, and how long the results lasted.

Review of Regional Draft Model Regulation

- The group discussed Beverly's changes to the draft body art regulations. The
 group discussed the differences in how experience is measured with tattoo
 artists, body piercers, and permanent makeup artists. Permanent makeup
 experience is generally tracked in hours, while tattoo and piercing experience is
 tracked in years.
- The group reviewed definitions to approve terms that were not in the previous draft. The group discussed the definition of a piercing gun and whether they are prohibited in body art establishments altogether, or whether its use on areas other than earlobes is prohibited. The group also discussed the differences between mobile and temporary establishments. The group also discussed the

- differences between permanent makeup and microblading, which is a type of permanent makeup that is limited to the eyebrows.
- The group discussed exemptions to the regulation and body art procedures that are performed in a licensed medical facility and medical spas, which are licensed by the state.
